






The Document Gap, Not a Skill Gap



Most PMs know how to **write a good spec**. They just cannot write it at the quality it deserves **AND do everything else** simultaneously.

The Two-Plugin Architecture



Command Routing

Layer 1 (Official Plugin)

Deep Indigo

Layer 2 (Custom Plugin)


Muted Plum

Context as the Gravitational Core



A `/brief` command without this core produces generic templates. With it, it produces a document written by a two-year team veteran.

Discovery: Framing the Right Problem

Solution-Prescriptive

Uses verbs like build, add, integrate.

Anchoring risk is high.

Leads to confirmation bias.

"Add a dashboard."

Problem-Focused

Uses verbs like struggle, wait, lose.

Anchoring risk is low.

Leads to evidence-based discovery.

"Analysts cannot automate reports."

Command Execution

```
> /brief  
Analyzing input...  
Enforcing problem-focus...  
Generating Discovery Brief...
```

Rule: NEVER propose a solution in a problem brief. Acknowledging uncertainty is strength.



PRDs & The 60% MUST Rule




If more than 60% of functional requirements are labeled MUST, the scope is too large.

The MUST Test: If this were not ready on launch day, would we delay the entire initiative?
If no, it is a SHOULD.



Architecture Map



Key Insight: A PRD requires a Failure Threshold. Define the specific outcome that forces a change of direction before launch to prevent sunk-cost escalation.

Execution: Story Splitting Triggers

Mandatory Anatomy

- ✓ Persona (from product.local.md)
- ✓ Capability (NOT a UI element)
- ✓ User Outcome (NOT a system action)

Roadmap Frameworks & Audience

Now / Next / Later (Default)

Best for external comms/execs. Avoids false date expectations.

Quarterly Themes

Best for strategy alignment. Use for internal planning.

OKR-Aligned

Best for executive accountability.


Timeline / Gantt

Best for internal engineering ONLY.
Avoid for customers (reads as a contract).

> /roadmap-update Generates tailored roadmap outputs based on audience parameters to prevent false precision traps.

Prioritization: RICE Blindspots

RICE Framework & Blindspots



Judgment Gate

1. Strategic Necessity (The Override Test)

If a low-scorer will be built anyway (e.g. CEO promise), document the override. Don't fake the math.

Judgment Gate

2. Data Gaps

Low confidence + high effort = Trigger a 2-week Discovery Spike.

Judgment Gate

3. User Love (The Regret Test)

If we shipped nothing else, what would our best customers be most grateful for?

Sprint Planning: Capacity Arithmetic

$$[\text{Raw Days}] - [\text{PTO} + \text{On-Call} + \text{Meetings}] \times 75\% = [\text{Planning Capacity}]$$

Why 75%?

Interrupts and complexity always consume the remaining 25%. 100% capacity guarantees missed commitments.

Units


Measured in Person-Sprints.

> /sprint-planning Focus on a singular, testable Sprint Goal bounded by undeniable mathematics.


Proactive Operation & Risk Signaling

Sprint Timeline

Reactive PM - Stays Green until Day 10, then drops suddenly to Red (Chaos/Escalation).



Proactive PM - The Standard - Signals Yellow at the first sign of risk (Day 4).



ROAM Risk Framework

[Owned]


[Accepted]

If an 'Owned' risk lacks a named owner and mitigation plan, it is an unmanaged risk.


The Stakeholder Translation Matrix

Core Rule: Never send the same version of an update to different audiences.
